#### You Are What You Eat

The trend of eating increasing amounts of processed foods has been linked to a dramatic increase in childhood obesity, high blood pressure, and other illnesses. As parents, we are obligated to guarantee good health and safety to our children, which includes teaching them healthy eating habits and how to select foods that energize their minds and bodies. If we can choose to put quality gas in our cars, we can take the time to influence the food choices for our children.

For many of us, school meals are a significant component of our children's daily diet. I urge all parents to visit the school cafeteria and sample the meals that are provided there. Would you like to see meals with fewer additives and processed foods? Would you like to see more nutritional information about the foods that are served? Some schools (like Hyde Elementary for example) have redirected school funds and chosen vendors that provide healthier meals. Would you like to know more about the possibilities?

Another way we can improve our children's diet is to introduce snacks that include more fruits, vegetables, and whole grains. Some **healthy options** are Fiber One Bars, dried fruit, nuts, rice cakes, and real chocolate. Energy drinks and fruit juices should be limited, and drinking water should be encouraged.

- 1. Send a blank email message to Shepherd\_Elementary\_PTA-subscribe @yahoogroups.com.
- 2. Go to www.yahoo.com and access "Groups" in the left-hand menu. Find Shepherd Elementary (http://groups.yahoo.com/group/shepherd\_elementary\_pta), and click the button that says "Join this group!" (You will need to register with Yahoo Groups to do this, but registration is free. Having a Yahoo ID will allow you to access the group webpage, download group files, and modify your membership settings.)
- 3. Write a note with your name and email address (printed clearly!) and put it in the PTA mailbox in the main office.

Members can send messages to the group at **Shepherd\_Elementary\_PTA@yahoogroups.com**. All communications are moderated by the PTA Board before they are posted. Content must be of interest to the school community as a whole and of course respectful in tone and content.

Choose one of three ways to receive messages: Individual Emails (every posted message comes to you as a separate email), Daily Digest (receive one email per day that contains all the messages posted), or No Email (no messages are sent to you, but you can read them at any time on the group webpage at http://groups.yahoo.com/group/shepherd\_elementary\_pta/).

# **Volunteering at Shepherd Requires Application**

In an effort to safeguard our children, DCPS now requires anyone who wishes to interact with students—whether it is to read a story, help during recess, or serve as a substitute teacher—must now fill out a Volunteer Application. The application process includes providing references, getting a TB test, and getting fingerprinted by DCPS for a criminal background check. Parents can download the application from the DCPS website at: http:// www.k12.dc.us/offices/ospp/volunteers.htm or they can get one from Mrs. Brooks in the main office. Downtown, the first stop is Tanya Archie, 9<sup>th</sup> floor (442-5619). Since we do not yet know how long this process takes, the sooner your form is submitted, the better.

### **Box Tops for Education Update**

As we inch toward winter break, keep collecting and turning in your General Mills box tops for Shepherd's Box Tops for Education initiative. Collection sheets (and updates) can be found in the rack in the main corridor just outside the school office. They're bright green, so you can't miss 'em! Remember to use only tape or glue—not staples, ever—when affixing box tops to the collection sheets.

The program does not accept Betty Crocker points, so don't include them. Likewise, expired box tops and box tops whose dates are cut off are not accepted. (And don't photocopy the box tops, either.) When the sheet is filled in, turn it in to the Box Tops Collection Box at the school office. We are already three-fourths of the way to reaching our goal of \$500.
