Dear Shepherd Family,

Saturday Academy:

Saturday school will begin tomorrow, January 24, 2009. We are so excited to be afforded the opportunity and funds to offer this experience to our students. Currently, the language classes are full; however, we are anticipating additional slots for parents and students after tomorrow's classes.

A select group of students have been invited to attend the academy to prepare for the upcoming DC CAS. The initial invite was extended to students who scored within a particular range on DC BAS tests P and A. Currently we have space available for approximately 5-6 students in each grade level. If you are interested, please email Mrs. Miles (jamie.miles@dc.gov) no later than 10 pm Friday night (Jan. 23, 2009) to express interest.

Final logistical information was sent home with those students who accepted the invitation to participate in our Saturday Academy. If you did not receive the information, please see below.

Logistical Information for Saturday Academy:

- Arrival and Dismissal will take place in the school auditorium. Students should report to the auditorium at their designated time and gather in the area designated for their grade level and/or group.
- All students must enter the auditorium using the Jonquil entrance. All other entrances will be secure.
- Parents must report to the auditorium to pick up their student. No student will be allowed to meet his/her parent(s) outside.
- Students participating in DC CAS prep and students in Language group #1 should report to school at 8:15 am. (A light breakfast will be provided).
- DC CAS prep students will be dismissed from the auditorium at 12:30 pm.
- Language group # 1 will be dismissed from the auditorium at 9:45 am.
- Language group # 2 should report to the auditorium at 9:45 am.
- Language group # 2 will be dismissed from the auditorium at 11:15 am (snacks will be provided).
- Language group # 3 should report to school at 11:15 am (snacks will be provided).
- Language group # 3 will be dismissed at 12:45 pm.
- All parents must escort their student to the auditorium on the first day to sign-in and verify registration information. Students may enter the building alone after the first Saturday.
- Students in the Saturday Academy will be recognized for perfect attendance.

Why We're Proud

For those of us who are African-American, it's an immense source of pride that Barack Obama is becoming the first black president of the United States. For many it represents the culmination of all that generations before him have worked for.

Because Obama is becoming our 44th president, we're reducing PTA dues to \$44 – but only through January 28th's PTA meeting (*note new January PTA meeting date*). Also ending on the 28th is our offer to cut your Family Enrichment Fee contribution from the typical \$500 max to \$365, to reflect how many electoral votes Obama won in the November election. As we like to do at Shepherd, the classrooms with the highest percentage of children whose parents belong to the PTA will win a pizza party.

We are the parents of hundreds of winning children. But winning is only one step in a long journey. Please join the PTA to give your children the opportunity to make change themselves!

The Buzz

In meetings with representatives from the Department of Parks and Recreation, Shepherd Park Citizens' Association, and Shepherd Elementary School, DPR staff shared plans for an upgrade of the lower field that will include a U-12 size soccer field (about 80% of a regular field), a new walking track, an outdoor classroom, bleachers on the big hill, and a large tot lot on the Jonquil Street end with two age appropriate climbing pieces and other play equipment. Erosion on the big hill will be corrected, old trees removed, and new landscaping done.

In addition, the landscaping at the Marvin Caplan Park bounded by Holly Street, 13th Street, and Alaska Avenue will be improved, more signage added, and a few passive climbing rocks located near 13th Street.

DPR will present drawings at the Shepherd Park Citizens' Association Potluck on January 25th and have a staff member available to answer questions. A neighborhood meeting devoted entirely to this upgrade will be held on Feb. 19th at Shepherd Elementary School. This meeting will be sponsored jointly by SPCA, Muriel Bowser's Office, and the Advisory Neighborhood Commission for the area.

Other DPR opportunities for Shepherd Park are in the works. Be alert for further information.

January Parent Meetings


The January Parent Meeting for parents of students in grades 3, 4, 5, and 6 was held last night (January 22).

Songs of Freedom and Justice Concert Set for February



Shepherd Elementary School, under the direction of music teacher Mr. Ken Giles, will present a musical history of America, "Songs of Freedom and Justice: 150 Years of American History in Song."

There will be two performances. The public performance will be held Thursday, February 12, at 6:45 p.m. Numbered tickets will

be sold for \$5 each, and extra contributions are welcome at the door. Tickets go on sale starting at next Wednesday's PTA meeting on January 28. Parents are invited to a free-admission dress rehearsal to be held Wednesday, February 11, also at 6:45 p.m.

The concert will feature 25 songs and 30 historical characters tracing American history from the anti-slavery era through the union movement to the civil rights movement. Students will portray such historical figures as Harriet Tubman, Frederick Douglass, and Bernice Johnson Reagon.

The D.C. Labor Chorus will sing with Shepherd's students throughout the show.

Both the dress rehearsal and the performance will be recorded for a CD. Each and every Shepherd student will receive a free CD. If you want to buy extra CDs to give to neighbors, friends and family, you can order them for \$10 each, also starting Jan. 28 at the PTA meeting. CDs should be available about a couple of months after the show.

CDs and copies of the script will be sent to school music teachers around the country to show them how easy it can be to mount their own production of "Songs of Freedom and Justice."


There are grants ranging from \$5,000 all the way up to \$100,000 that could be ours if we do our jobs right.
