No School Friday- April 16, 2010 -Emancipation Day Holiday

Washington, D.C., celebrates April 16 as Emancipation Day. On that day in 1862, President Lincoln signed the Compensated Emancipation Act which ended slavery in our city 8½ months before the Emancipation Proclamation was issued.

DC-CAS

This is the last week of classes before we take the DC CAS. The DC CAS is an important measure of students' academic achievement. Last year we made a 12-point gain in math and four-point gain in reading. We are striving to make gains again this year.

The assessment begins on Tuesday, April 20, and ends on Friday, April 30, for students in third through fifth grades. The test is untimed and is divided into eight sections (four math and four reading). Students take one test section a day. In addition to reading and math, students in fourth grade take a writing composition assessment and fifth-grade students will take a science assessment.

It will be a long two weeks for everyone. Special-area teachers and many of the education aides will be serving as test administrators or proctors. Students will not be on a normal schedule and the special-area schedule will be adjusted. It is imperative that all students arrive on time and remain in school all day. Our goal is a 100% test participation rate. Students in grades 3-5 who arrive to school on time every-day during testing and do their best work will be invited to attend an after-test Jam with live music and food.

Breakfast with Principal Miles on April 19, 2010

On Monday, April 19, all students in grades 3-5 are invited to each lunch with Principal Miles in the cafeteria. Students should plan to arrive between 8 and 8:30 a.m.

Uniform Reminder

We are a uniform school. Please do not send your student to school in spaghetti-strap tops, too-short skirts and shorts. If you send your student to school in a skirt please make sure they have bikers or some sort of shorts underneath. Please do not allow your student to wear flip-flops, high heels or sandals to school. Students go outside every day and these type of shoes can be a safety hazard. In addition, they break easily when students run and walk and we often are asked to help repair the shoe or shoes.

Behavior Expectations

Please take time to remind your student about behavior expectations. Warm weather often brings out more frequent misbehaviors among our students. Students who have been friends with one another all year will suddenly decide they do not like one another. Students who have never gotten into trouble at school will suddenly find themselves in the middle of an altercation. Please encourage your student to make good choices, walk away from conflict and seek the nearest adult if they need assistance. Though we recognize the effects of warm weather, we will not tolerate inappropriate behavior. Students have been told consequences will be implemented if they cannot make wise choices.

Did You Get the Message?

There is a lot happening at Shepherd and sometimes it is even difficult for me to keep up with the many events. Therefore I have decided to send weekly voice mail messages. PTA Meeting Next Wednesday


This is an official notice that there will be a PTA meeting next Wednesday, April 21, at 6:45 p.m. in the school auditorium.


