



Mandatory Back to School Meetings

All parents Pre-K through 5th grade are required to attend one of three Back to School meetings and/or view the presentation (coming soon). The first meeting was held on Thursday, Aug. 30, at 9 a.m. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, Sept. 6, at 4 p.m. and a final session on Sept. 19, at 6 p.m. The purpose of these meetings are to alert of you key changes at Shepherd during the 2012-13 school year, share with you our academic priorities and address any questions you may have.

School-Wide Behavior Model

The school-wide behavior model consists of three levels. The more serious the infraction, the higher the level. In order to maintain open and ongoing communication between home and school, parents will be informed of all behavior infractions via email. These emails are for your knowledge. There is no need for you to follow up with your child's teacher unless requested. However, we do ask that you speak to your student about his/her behavior and remind your student of the expectations (Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe). Infrequent Level 1 behaviors are handled by the classroom teacher. These behaviors do not require parent and teacher intervention unless the behavior becomes persistent.

Shepherd Elementary will maintain a "level" system for handling infractions of behavioral

The great rhythm-and-blues composer, arranger and bassist Willie Dixon said, "The blues is the roots, everything else is the fruits." We need to understand the blues, its musical structure, and its influence on much of the music we all listen to.

Therefore, in our next music class, we will sing some traditional blues songs, such as Lead Belly's "Good Morning Blues." And then our students will compose their own blues songs, using the 12-bar form for the lyrics. We'll put the best verses together and create a "Shepherd School Blues." And we will perform some blues and jazz songs in our February 6 concert, "Blues, Jazz and Message Songs." Next time you hear your favorite song, see if you can count the 12-bar pattern in it.

expectations. Outlined below is the level system along with the instructions for handling such behaviors:

Level 1 Behaviors Include:

- Inappropriate language (cursing and name calling)
- Pushing/Shoving
- Behaviors that interfere with teaching and learning
- Defiance, disrespect, insubordination, noncompliance
- Lying, cheating
- Running in classroom, hall or building
- Leaving class without permission
- Use of toys, cell phones or other portable electronic devices during school hours
- Communication with staff and peers that is not polite, courteous or respectful
- Teasing/Taunting (physical and/or verbal)
- Littering/Loitering
- Disruption, excessive talking

<u>Step 1:</u> Level 1 behaviors are to be handled by the classroom teacher or staff member witnessing such behaviors. The behaviors should be noted on the Staff Handled Problem Behavior Form (A) and an FYI email or note (B) should be sent to the parent each time a teacher completes a Staff Handled Problem Behavior Form.

Note: Special area teachers and other staff members who witness Level 1 behaviors are responsible for completing the Staff Handled Problem Behavior Form (A) and giving it to the classroom teacher. The classroom teacher will send the FYI message to parents; however, the special area teacher is responsible for maintaining their own records and taking the appropriate actions if the behavior persists.

<u>Step 2:</u> If behaviors persist, the classroom teacher or special area teacher should call the parent to advise them that the teacher will meet with the student for the purpose of goal-setting. One of the following staff members may be a resource for this process: principal, counselor, International Baccalaureate Coordinator, special education coordinator, social

worker, or instructional coach, The teacher may contact the personnel directly or by completing a Student in Need of Assistance form (C) and placing it in the appropriate mailbox. The teacher should phone parent(s) to inform them of the goal (s) sheet and include them in the goal setting process. An email or note may be sent only if unable to reach parents by phone. After two weeks, parent (s) should be contacted regarding the student's response to the goals set. Each parent contact should be documented on the phone log (D).

<u>Step 3:</u> If Level 1 behaviors have not improved after four weeks and/or five Staff-Handled Problem Behavior Forms have been completed within a four-week time frame, an Office Referral should be made. At the time of the referral all Staff Handled Problem Forms (A) and the Office Referral Form (E), should be submitted.

<u>Level 1- In School Administrator Administered</u> Disciplinary Actions:

After-school detention, loss of privileges (i.e. field trip, participation in classroom party or special treat), exclusion from extracurricular activities, written reflection, conflict resolution, loss of recess, mediation, or similar actions that do not result in student's loss of academic instructional time

Morning Arrival/Before-Care

If your student is in before-care, please refrain from sending and/or dropping your student(s) off before 7:30 a.m. Before-care begins at 7:30 a.m. I have had the pleasure of being greeted by students at 7 a.m. when I arrive at school. Dropping your students off before this time can be viewed as negligent, and it is a huge safety concern. There is no one present to supervise students. Between 7:30 a.m. and 8 a.m. parents should escort their student to the cafeteria via the back playground door.

Breakfast

Breakfast is always free for students. Students wishing to participate in our breakfast program should plan to arrive between 8-8:20 a.m. Breakfast students should enter the cafeteria via the back

playground door. The cafeteria will not serve breakfast after 8:30 a.m.

Regular Arrival

Students who are not enrolled in before-care and students who are not participating in our breakfast program should arrive to school between 8:20 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. Students who arrive before 8:20 a.m. will not be allowed to enter the building. Supervision of students begins at 8:20 a.m. If you need to bring/send your student to school before this time, please enroll them in our before-care program. Students should enter through the gymnasium.

Morning Announcements

This year our morning announcements begin at 8:35 a.m. During the announcements, students receive lunch, weather and news update. School-specific announcements are made, birthday shouts are given and students recite the Pledge of Allegiance and the school pledge. Please plan to arrive no later than 8:35 a.m. to ensure your student's participation in our morning routine.

Tardiness

The gym doors are open from 8:20 a.m. until 8:45 a.m. The doors close at 8:45 a.m. Students arriving after 8:45 (after the gymnasium doors closes) are considered tardy and should enter through the main entrance. Upon entering, students should stop by the security desk for a tardy slip before proceeding to class. Parents: Please refrain from opening the gymnasium doors and allowing students to enter after the doors have been closed.

Afternoon Dismissal

The official school day ends at 3:15 p.m. Students are dismissed between 3:15 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please arrive on time. If you are unable to arrive during the designated time, please sign up for aftercare. There will be no calls from the main office between 3-3:30 p.m. If you need to pick your student up for early dismissal, please plan to arrive before 3 p.m. Students are dismissed from three areas. 
